

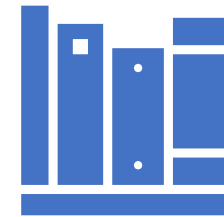

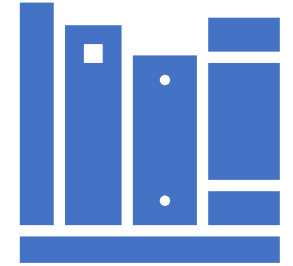




Research Findings

ANPs' (Emergency) perceptions of their role, position within the organisation and emergent professional identity are multidimensional, complex and unique within the field of healthcare practice in Ireland

Conclusions

Recommendations: nursing, education, management and future research



- increasing awareness of ANPs' (Emergency) role and scope of practice amongst healthcare personnel
- forging links between nursing academics and ANP clinicians to create appropriate course curricula for ANPs' continuing professional development
- Reviewing and future planning of nursing roles to include ANPs at strategic levels
- Support scaffolding for doctoral study
